Main Topics to share

- Carers Leave Act 2023 became law on 24th May 23. Carers Leave allows those who care for a dependant to take up to 1 weeks' worth (taken flexibly or as full or half days) of paid carers leave to care for or arrange care for their dependant. This great news and enables carers to continue caring and not being penalised in their job role as a result.
- As a surgery we have been asking patients to attend various clinics to check their overall health, blood pressure (for hypertension), asthma and diabetes amongst a few. All these checks are for patients own benefit and to help monitor the conditions in everyone.
- The Campaign 'Keep warm, keep well this winter' was rolled out over the past few months to ensure that those with young children, elderly and/or a health condition are kept safe.
- The Mental Health Integrated Community Care Transformation Programme has a new name 'Access Wellbeing'. Access Wellbeing is for anyone aged 18+ that needs quick and effective access to services and support using community facilities and online. It will focus on wellbeing, intervention, prevention, and community engagement. The most local hub to Kinson Road Medical Surgery opening from 2024 will be in the Dolphin Centre, Poole. The other hub will be at Hope House in Weymouth.
- Mr Amos has joined our Primary Care Network (PCN) as a dedicated Mental Health practitioner.
